

Scholarship Criteria for Budo Specialization Program of International Budo University

This scholarship is intended to support academic and student life to individuals who are recognised as possessing advanced skills and knowledge in Budo and who will contribute to the teaching and dissemination of Budo abroad. You can only apply if your Budo experience meets the following application criteria.

Scholarship applicants must complete and sign the scholarship application form and send it together with the documents relating to your most recent competition history. However, scholarship recipients are subject to strict screening by the International Budo University Scholarship Committee, so applications are not guaranteed to be successful. Only those who have been selected to receive the scholarship will be informed in person by the International Office.

Event	Grade	Criteria
Judo	First Dan or above	Those who have competed as an athlete or instructor in competitions organized and administered by the International Judo Federation (IJF) and their national judo federations (NFs) and have achieved major results. In addition, those who are eligible for real-time web-based judging.
Kendo	First Dan or above	Those who have competed as an athlete or instructor in world-level competitions (including continental competitions) organized and administered by the International Kendo Federation (FIK) and have achieved major results.
Kyudo	First Dan or above	Those who have competed as an athlete or instructor in world-level competitions (excluding continental competitions) organized and administered by the International Kyudo Federation (IKYF) and have achieved major results.
Karatedo	First Dan or above	Those who have competed as an athlete or instructor in world-level competitions (excluding continental competitions) organized and administered by the World Karate Federation (WKF) and have achieved major results.
Aikido	Fifth Dan or above	Those who have competed as an athlete or instructor in world-level competitions (e.g. World Games) as an athlete or instructor recognized by the Aikikai Foundation and member organizations of the International Aikido Federation (IAF), and have achieved major results. Those who have achieved a 5th dan or above recognized by the Aikikai Foundation.
Naginata	First Dan or above	Those who have competed as an athlete or instructor in world-level competitions (excluding continental competitions) organized and administered by the International Naginata Federation (INF) and have achieved major results.
Shorinji-Kempo	First Dan or above	Those who have competed as an athlete or instructor in world-level competitions (including continental competitions) organized and administered by the World Shorinji Kempo Organization (WSKO) and have achieved major results.
